1.0	Ground must give the impression of being a football ground suitable for the National League System Viewing possible from the full length of at least 2 sides of the ground (No Spectator access unless hard-standing)		
1.1	Security of Tenure - Adequate Security of Tenure, Copies held at office (remainder of this and all of next season)		
1.2	Ground Sharing permitted (not to gain promotion or avoid relegation) providing use of facilities on Match Days		
1.3	Capacity requirements (grade E requires 1000)	N/A	
1.4	Boundary to the Grnd Permanent & Secure 1.83m high external (NB grade E and above cannot be see-through) boundaries with private property may be allowed

1.8	Pitch Standards Grass (or artificial authorised by league) Pitch to be well maintained, free from depressions and excessive undulations. Maximum slope allowed (1:41) Artificial to have annual FIFA test by 28 th February		
1.9	Playing Area to be minimum 100 x 64 m (110 x 70 yds) Goalposts, supports and Nets to meet safety standards		
1.10	Technical Area Marked as in the Laws of the Game. Two covered trainers boxes marked Home and Away/Visitors (may be part of a seated stand) Portable boxes permitted –securely fixed when in use Boxes to be equal distance from halfway line to be ideally a minimum of 3 metres apart Fixed Seats or Benches to accommodate 8 people (4m)		
1.11	Secure Walkway - Clubs must provide for safe passage of players and match officials between their dressing rooms and the pitch. The passage onto and off the pitch must be suitably enclosed when players/officials are leaving/entering the field of play. Adequate stewarding and procedures (Inc Jackets) ready to respond to situations, and spectator behaviour.		
1.12	Floodlighting Average Lux reading must be minimum of 120 (180 for new and upgraded installations) – no, one reading to be less than one quarter of highest reading. Current Grid from approved contractor within the last 2 yrs.		
1.13	PA System (needed for F) need to convey information	N/A	
1.14	Entrance to ground via Turnstile or Pay box with protection for operator and Hard Standing to viewing area		
1.15	Location and number of Exits to be accessed by hard standing from the viewing area – to be clearly signed with “running man” signs and to be kept clear		
1.16	Emergency Lighting consideration must be given by a club to its procedures in the event of a power failure.	N/A	
1.17	Adjoining pitches There must be no ball games played whilst matches are in progress		
1.18	Emergency Access must be provided and maintained free from obstruction.

	Minimum Number of Seats in Stand(s) must be 50 Bench seating to be marked, min 50 seats in each stand		
	Hard (Bound) Standing on all sides of Ground (unless alternative agreed - sect 1.0) min width 0.9m from barrier		
	Min 16 seats provided for Directors/Committee. seats must be clearly marked Home and Away Directors (For grade F)	N/A	
2.2	Press Seating (Grade E requires 2 seats)	N/A	
2.3	Terracing Where provided, must comply with the requirements of the Guide to Safety at Sports Grounds. All terracing must be in a sound condition. If crumbling, has grass/weeds growing through it or broken/ loose concrete will not be accepted. Any surface should be hard-standing and level. Flat well-maintained grass areas or the use of tree bark instead of grass may be allowed, subject to prior permission obtained from the league		
2.4	Toilets Facilities located within the ground for spectators, Signed and kept to a high level of cleanliness must include wash basins, warm hand driers and/or paper towels and toilet paper. Can be in Clubhouse if available match days and provided not a great distance. (not at Higher grades) Temp facilities connected to mains drainage are allowed

2.51	Directors/Committee/Guests refreshments must be available for officials and guests

2.6	Disabled Facilities No specific requirement is currently included but The Football Association strongly recommends that access is provided to both a covered viewing area and toilet and refreshment facilities.	Recommended

3.1	Dressing Room Facilities for Players Separate dressing rooms must be provided for both teams within the enclosed area of the ground. The dressing rooms must be of sound construction and be permanent. Dressing room a minimum of 12m ² (18m ² for new build), excluding shower and toilet. Must have Hot/Cold Water & be clean/secure
